### Tour Report

All India study tour is an essential part of our curriculum and on this ground a 23 days tour for the 1999 admission commenced on September 24, 2003. The tour team consisted for 28 members including two teachers - Dr. Sudheer. K.P. and Er. Sasikala. D.

#### Goa

The 23 days long study tour began on September 24. We started from college at 4:30 pm in our college bus, leaving behind a number of waving hands. Everyone was keen waiting for the train at Kuttippuram to reach the station by 5:30 pm. All faces glared with joy. At last the moment arrived and we bordered the Nethravathi express. It was a pleasant journey. We arrived at Mudgon by 7:30 am and were left waiting for another 2 hours. All were busy staring the people arriving and departing the station. Our bus arrived at 9:30 am and we checked in Panaji Youth hostel by 11:00 am.

At 3:00 pm we were accompanied to Goa beach. Long sandy beaches fringed with coconut palms make it a tropical paradise for visitors. It was quiet, calm and enjoyable. By 5:30 pm we had our tickets for boating. It was a one-hour trip. Nearly 75 passengers were there. Most of them were from different parts of the country, speaking number of languages and colourful dresses. Goan girls & boys performed dances in the boat. Every one had the choice to join them. There was provision of snacks and other food items in the boat. At 7:00 pm all the programs were over and we were ashore. It was a wonderful evening with the Goans. At 8:00 pm we returned back to our hostel after having dinner. The first visit of our tour was quiet successful.

The next day began with our visit to ICAR Research Complex. On our way, we stepped down at St.Francis Church, which took 90 years to complete. The basilica of born Jesus is venerated for the mortal remains of St Francis Xavier. It is known to be one of the oldest churches. At ICAR Research Complex, Er Manivannan headed us and we received details regarding trenches, bunds, terraces, multislot devisor etc with a field visit. These informations are very useful related to our course. Around 1:00 p.m. we reached the National Institute of Oceanography. It aims at improving our understanding of seas around





us and to translate this knowledge to beneficial to all. Then we visited a temple of Shanta Durga Devi along our way to Donapola, which is one of the beautiful beaches. From here the Mormugao harbour can be seen on the opposite side of river Maudovi. The beach was named after an American lady who committed suicide for the sake of love. We had some purchasing along the beach. The waves in the sea as it hits the rock create a feeling of thrill. Darkness began to sweep around it was time to bid goodbye to the beautiful state. We boarded the Konkan kanya Kumari Express at 6:00 p.m. and continued our journey to Mumbai.

#### Mumbai

We reached Mumbai CST on an overcast humid morning (27-09-2003) at 6:30 am. Then we moved on to the place where our accommodation had been arranged. It was the Salvation Army, red shield house in Mery weather road. This was situated at the heart of the city i.e.; near the Taj hotel and gateway of India. We checked into our hotel and deposited our luggage and got back to our bus. At 9:30 am we setoff to visit ASPEE (American spring and pressing work limited). It was a long journey by bus. But it was fun looking out of the window. The features of the city that would probably tease your eyes first could be its beautiful women. The streets were highly packed with vehicles. But despite the heavy traffic we managed to reach ASPEE by 1:30 pm. There we visited various units of production like the raw material store, injection moulding unit etc. the instructor gave us valuable information regarding hand compression sprayer and power sprayer. Then we moved back. It was about 6:00 pm when we reached the main shopping centre of the city. The Fashion City is an ideal shopping place for an assortment of articles. The city has a tendency to absorb anything and anyone unlike other metros. Of late, half a dozen shopping malls have also come up in the city mainly on roadsides.

On 28-09-03 at 9am we went to the Gateway of India and after a photo session we moved on to the Nehru Research Centre and Nehru science centre. Then we went to Chotta Kashmir. Then found out that unlike other concrete jungles, this city has space for everything, including bids and green trees. It also has a scenic lake. Then we moved on to

the Juhu Beach. The bay on marine drive, haunted by the cream of Mumbai, has karaoke nights from Sunday to Tuesday and live music from Wednesday to Saturday

There is more to this city than an afternoon spent in a museum or a quiet dinner in a garden restaurant. Pubs, coffeebars, and multiplexes are multiplying and cornering around the whole city. As the evening came to a close, we had one dinner and rushed to railway station.

#### Karnal

We reached the Karnal Railway station at about 8:00 am on 30<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2003 by Dadar Amritsar Express. The railway station at Karnal was comparatively small. Our accommodation was arranged at Farmer's Hostel NDRI (National Dairy research Institute), which was very near to the station. So our journey to the hostel was, by cycle rickshaw, for the first and last time in the tour and it was really enjoyable. The breakfast was arranged at the hostel itself.

At about 10:00 am, we reached the conference hall at NDRI. There we had given a brief introduction about NDRI. This institute imparts practical training to dairy engineering students in their 3<sup>rd</sup> year of study. It also provides training on processing, packaging, administration, marketing etc. The capacity of the plant is about 60,000litres of milk. The various products manufactured are ice cream, cheese, khoa, and dahi. Different sections of NDRI were seen and the dairy-engineering students gave brief descriptions about each section to us.

IARI (Indian Agricultural Research Institute) Regional station for seed treatment, Karnal, just opposite to the NDRI campus, was our next spot. There we had an exposure to different processing equipment's like hot air drier, indented cylinder separator, specific gravity separator, vacuum fumigation machine, colour sorter etc. We returned back to NDRI and all of us tasted the ice cream, which was sold in the sales counter of NDRI. That was all about the visit at Karnal and we reached the Karnal Railway Station at 6:00pm and left Karnal at 6:35 pm by Unchachar Express.

#### Delhi

At the last moment of the 6<sup>th</sup> day of our All India Study tour, we reached Delhi at 9:00 p.m. by Unchahar Express (4518). A representative from farmer's hostel received us and led to the farmer's hostel (Farmer's Hostel, IARI Pusa, New Delhi 110012). They had arranged us northern style dish and two dorms for stay.

Next morning, after taking breakfast from the farmer's hostel, we left there to complete that days tour programme. The luggage for a single day stay at Mussorie was also taken with us. On this day we had our visit to Indian agricultural Research Institute, which is the largest research institution of ICAR. There we had an exposure to green house and fertigation control unit. Here the lecture was given by one of the former students of K.C.A.E.T., Er. K.P.Vidhu. There we saw a unit in which a mixture of kaolinite, cow dung and pyrolyte was used instead of soil for growing plants. Then we turned to the National Phytotron Facility, the only one in Asia. Phytotron is a controlled environment research facility for plants to study the effect of environment on the plant system inorder to understand how environment is shaping it. It is a highly sophisticated technique, which give rise to evolution of new varieties and technologies. It is an India-Israel combined project established in 1997.

From there we head to Theen- murthy Bhavan, the residence of first Indian Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru. There we saw the golden memories of Nehru. Then we moved to Nehru planetarium from where we had seen very interesting and informative space show- A way to Mars. On the way to Theen-murthy Bhavan, we had a view of Gyarah murthy sculpture. It is a martyr's memorial designed by D. P. Chowdlay, caste in bronze. Mahatma Gandhi is dominant among the figures of well-known Indians who struggled for India's independence.

Then we have hardly seen much of the capital; Indira Bhavan, Rashtrapathi Bhavan and Parliament house. In the middle we had a delicious lunch of our homeland from Kerala house. It gave us really a nostalgic feeling.

The Qutab Minar, one of the city's most famous sights was our next destination. It is a 5-storey, 72m tower of red sandstone, built by Lakh-Baksh Qutab-Uddin-Aibak. The Qutab Minar stands to the south east of the Quwwet ui Islam mosque. In front of this there is an iron pillar, truly a marvel of metallurgical skill. Those who can encircle the pillar with both hands are dreamed to be fortunate. But now days it is not opened to the public.

Then we head to the Bahai Temple, also called lotus temple because of its design. Built in 1986, it is open to members of all faiths. The sheer magnificence of the structure and gaze at the ceiling, which is very high and meets at a point, was really amazing. After a few minutes of meditation, we left to the railway station.

Because of heavy traffic block we were late to arrive at old Delhi railway station to catch train for Dehradun. Few were missing in the way, others catched up in different compartments. In a hurry-burry, somehow we managed to come together in our compartment by right time. Thus we left from Delhi to Mussorie for one day by Mussorie Express (4041).

After a day visit in Dehradun, we returned to Delhi by the same train and reached the destination on 4<sup>th</sup> October by 8.00am. On the way to the hostel, we did a round of Virbhumi and Rajghat. Rajghat, the samadhi of Mahatma Gandhi, is a simple black marble platform bearing Hindi words 'Hey Ram' and a flame burns continuously in a lamp at its head. By 9:30 am, we reached the International youth hostel, Chanakyapuri, New Delhi. This day had no specified tour schedule and it was specially meant for taking rest. Some of us went to Palika bazaar, the famous underground market especially for dresses.

On 5<sup>th</sup> October we left Delhi by 6:00am by Tamilnadu travels. Today's destination was Madhura and Agra. We took our breakfast from local shops near the roadside. By 10:00 am we reached the divine land Madhura- the birthplace of Lord Krishna. It has been a long day. The pollution and blaring horns have taken a toll. Without realizing it we have traveled over hundreds of kilometers and then reached Agra fort by 12:45pm. There we heard the history of Mughal dynasty from a guide. Muhammed-Quazim Khan, who is Akber's commander in chief, built it under the direction of Akbar and it took 8years to complete this majestic fart. The distant view of Taj Mahal itself was very beautiful.




## Bhopal

decided to unwind at Shifa's house. Her parents gave a warm welcome with many mouthwatering goodies. After the grand feast we returned back to hostel.

Our last day at Bhopal was reserved for visiting Eicher tractors. We reached there at 9:30am. Mr. Dinesh (Shifa's father) introduced us to an instructor who took us around for the industry visit. This session was very informative as well as interesting.

After lunch we set forth for Bhim Baidhika. It is the place recognized by archeological survey of India, as a place of historical importance. Evidences of ancient paintings believed to be drawn by the pandavas during their period of exile can still be seen on the rocks.

Carrying the golden memories of he Bhopal visit and expecting more on the next visit, we rushed to the station.

### Hyderabad

We reached Secunderabad station at about 12:00 noon by Kongu express. The bus arranged was already waiting there and we reached IGSMRI (Indian Grain Storage Management & Research Institution) about 1:30 p.m. Our accommodation was arranged at IGSMRI hostel. 
The second day in Hyderabad began with our visit to ICRISAT (International Crop Research Institute for Semi-Arid Tropics). We reached ICRISAT by 9:30am. We were given a brief introduction about ICRISAT. The researches at ICRISAT are centered about five important crops like pearl millet, sorghum, millet, groundnut, pigeon pea and

chickpea. ICRISAT provide farm and engineering services to support for researches. ICRISAT ownes a farm of about 1400 ha area. Then we moved to the farm and saw many agricultural operations going on with modern equipments like tandem disc harrow, rotovators, ridger and furrowers, roller packer, bed shaper, fertilizer placers, combine harvester, rolling cultivator, rotary cutter, plot harvesters, groundnut strippers etc. The visit to ICRISAT was very informative in all respects.

At about 3:00pm, we reached the Nehru Zoological Park. This park has open enclosures for a wide variety of animals. We were surprised by the collection of animals and the landscape in the Nehru Zoological park, which, we came away believing was the best zoo we have ever seen.

In the evening, we got another chance to feel the heart beat of Pearl City. The beautiful Kochampalli sarees and Kolapuri chappals attracted everybody and many of us purchased one or two pieces. We also visited the Thirumala Venkateswara temple and everybody enjoyed the beautiful view of the Hyderabad City from the temple. This is one of the holiest pilgrim centres of India. The temple is said to be the richest on account of offerings made by devotees.

The last day of our stay at Hyderabad was reserved for Golconda Fort and Salar Jung Museum. The time was too short, even otherwise, it would have been impossible to describe each hall in the museum provided or to picturise Golconda in its medieval glory.

All of us had heard a lot about Hyderabad Biriyani and so everybody opted it for the lunch, but it was not so good as we expected.

We reached the Kachiguda Station at 6.30pm and left the Pearl City by 7:00pm by Kachiguda Bangalore express to Bangalore.

## Bangalore

We reached the Garden city by Kacheguda- Bangalore express at 7:30 am. on 12<sup>th</sup> October. The bus arranged was already waiting there, by which we went to the Kairali Restaurant, which really had a Kerala touch. It was a relief from the north Indian food that

we were having for the last 19 days. We were served with delicious Kappa and Meencurry. After having the food we went to the Institute for Youth and Development, Koramangala, where we had our stay. Since it was a Sunday, no official visit was arranged. At around 12.00pm,we reached Lal-bagh, one of the best known gardens in the India. The beautiful botanical garden of Lal-bagh had more than thousand tropical and sub-tropical varieties of trees and plants in 240 acres, laid out by Hyder Ali in 1760 and substantially added by Tippu Sultan. It also has a glass house modeled on London's crystal palace, which was undergoing construction work. It also has a scenic lake. By around 2.00 pm. we left Lal-bagh and again went to the Kairali Restaurant for lunch.

Around 3.30 p.m., we reached the Visweswarayya Museum and spent one hour there. The Museum was very informative regarding the basic engineering aspects. Latest developments in Biotechnology were well exhibited. After that it was our time for shopping at Commercial Street, M.G.Road and Brigade Road, where anything and everything is available. Walking through Brigade road is itself an experience. Apart from Commercial Street and M.G.Road, Brigade Road is an ideal place for window-shopping. After shopping we went to Iskon temple. The long queue did not permit us to get into the temple. After dinner we reached the hostel back.

Next day started with our visit to V.S.T Tillers Tractors. It was established in the year 1960. Two officials at the V.S.T. explained to us about their products. The smallest tractor available in the country (18.5 hp) is manufactured by V.S.T. We were then taken to the manufacturing unit where we could see the C.N.C (Computerized Numerical Control) machine. After V.S.T., we went to Big-bazaar, in the Hosur Road, for a small scale shopping.

After having lunch, we started for Premier Irrigation and reached there at 3.00 pm. The officials at Premier were very excited to see us and gave us a detailed lecture about the micro irrigation systems. Many micro irrigation equipment like rain gun, super lock pipe, roto lock coupler, shoulder ended couple, hydrants, dispenser etc. were exhibited. Again it was time for shopping at the Gandhi Nagar in Bangalore. After having dinner we reached the hostel.

#### Mysore



Then we went to Chamundi hills, where the temple of goddess Chamundeswary was located. It was a nice place where the entire Mysore could be viewed. From there we went to Brindavan Garden at around 5.30 p.m. After a long walk through the beautiful garden we saw the Musical fountain and came back to our bus and then went to the youth hostel. We had the dinner from the hostel itself.

Next day at around 9.30 am. we vacated the hostel. Then we visited the St.Philomena's church, in Mysore. It is one of the oldest churches in our country. Our next destination was the famous Mysore Palace. After a long photo session, we entered the palace. The architectural beauty of the palace was fascinating. From the palace we went to K.R circle which was nearby, where many of us purchased Mysore silks and handicrafts. After having lunch at Nakshatra-a multi cuisine restaurant, we boarded the Mysore-Tanjavur express at 3.45 pm. and reached Bangalore at 6.30 pm. 
